KW-IRS, EDUCATION MINISTRY STRENGTHEN TIES FOR IMPROVED REVENUE AND SERVICE DELIVERY



he Executive Chairman, Kwara State Internal Revenue Service (KW-IRS), Shade Omoniyi, alongside some members of the Service's management team, on Wednesday, 2nd April, 2025, paid a courtesy visit to the Honorable Commissioner for Education and Human Capital Development, Dr Lawal Olohungbebe.

The visit aimed to congratulate the Commissioner on his assumption of office and discuss strategies to foster a stronger and mutually beneficial relationship between the Ministry and KW-IRS. The discussions focused on enhancing service delivery and improving the State's Internally Generated Revenue (IGR) while ensuring quality education remains accessible to all.

During the engagement, both parties emphasized the need for collaboration in revenue generation, particularly through fees associated with the Basic Education Certificate Examination (BECE) and the Senior School Certificate Examination (SSCE).

The Executive Chairman also commended the impressive performance of public schools in the State at the annual Tax Club Quiz Competition, which is a reflection of the current reforms in the education sector by His Excellency, the Governor of Kwara State, Mallam AbdulRahman AbdulRazaq, CON.

The Commissioner applauded the thoughtfulness and continual support of KW-IRS, promising to ride on existing collaboration and initiatives that would improve IGR collections for the State. He however pleaded with the Service on the closure of recalcitrant schools due to non-payment of taxes, stating that it could have adverse effects on the students.

In her response, Omoniyi promised to give adequate awareness and notice before embarking on enforcement of defaulting schools that have shown intention not to comply.

The meeting was attended by the KW-IRS Director, MDAs, Omotayo Ayinla, and some staff of both agencies.



INTER-AGENCY COLLABORATION FOR REVENUE GROWTH: KW-IRS VISITS MINISTRY OF TRANSPORT



In a bid to promote revenue growth in Kwara State, the Executive Chairman, Kwara State Internal Revenue Service, KW-IRS, Shade Omoniyi, paid a working visit to the Honourable Commissioner for Transport, Hon. Lafia Aliyu Kora Sabi, in his office on Wednesday, 2nd April, 2025.

Omoniyi congratulated the Commissioner on his new role and stated the need to strengthen the relationship between KW-IRS and the Ministry to promote revenue growth for the State. She emphasized the importance of collaboration in areas such as vehicle inspection systems, reviewing all platforms across the State, and improving the compliance in revenue collection by transporters.

In celebration of the awareness month, the Internal Audit Department of the Service organized a one-day training session and embarked on a department-to-department outreach to sensitize staff on the role and value of internal auditors, while correcting misconceptions surrounding audit function in public institutions.

Giving the opening remarks at the training, the Head, Internal Audit, Yinka Usman explained that the International Internal Audit Awareness Month is observed globally to recognize the importance of internal auditing, showcase achievements, and foster collaboration with stakeholders.

He emphasized the need for staff to appreciate the contributions of internal auditors and support ongoing efforts to enhance transparency and organizational growth. The training featured paper presentations on key topics including essentials of audit report writing, fraud prevention, detection and control, as well as skills required of an auditor. Participants also engaged in a robust question-and-answer session.

On his part, the Director, Admin and Operations, Yusuf La-Kadri, commended the internal auditors for upholding professionalism and advised them to broaden their perspective by embracing self-development and continuous learning. He stressed that auditors must keep up with regulatory changes and possess working knowledge of all aspects of the organization to perform effectively.

Furthermore, the Director, Legal and Compliance, Shehu Mogaji, urged the auditors to always ensure that credible evidence is provided when handling fraud-related cases, thereby ensuring fair and just disciplinary processes.

KWASAA AG. GENERAL MANAGER PAYS COURTESY VISIT TO KW-IRS

Manager (GM) of the Kwara State Signage and Advertisement Agency (KWASAA), Toba Adeyeye, in company of the Honourable Commissioner for Communications, Bola Olukoju, paid a courtesy call on the KW-IRS Executive Chairman, Shade Omoniyi, at the Corporate Head Office of the Service on Monday, 19th May, 2025.

Omoniyi explained that KW-IRS is the sole agency responsible for collecting all revenue accruing to the Kwara State government, but does not have access to it. Also speaking at the meeting, the KW-IRS Head, Parastatals, Abayomi Ajiboso welcomed the new Acting GM, he expressed optimism that KWASAA will witness appreciable progress under his leadership.

The new Ag GM applauded the Service on the continuous efforts towards boosting Kwara IGR. Adeyeye shared his vision and innovative strategies to ensure a complete restructuring of KWASAA in line with global standards and highlighted some peculiarities of the agency with respect to the harmonized billing system of KW-IRS. He therefore expressed his readiness to partner with the Service in the interest of the State.



KW-IRS SENSITIZES TAXPAYERS ON STAMP DUTY



s part of efforts to enhance tax compliance through continuous advocacy, the Kwara State Internal Revenue Service (KW-IRS) embarked on a week-long Stamp Duty sensitization campaign in Ilorin the State capital between 12th and 16th May, 2025.

Leading the campaign, the KW-IRS Commissioner for Stamp Duties, Abubakar Abdulmumini explained that the aim of the sensitization program was to educate taxpayers in the State, especially traders, business owners and individuals involved in executing contracts, agreements and other applicable transactions on the importance and benefits of stamp duty compliance in business transactions under the Law.

The campaign team visited some major markets and streets within the Ilorin metropolis including Mandate, Ipata, Oja Tuntun, Gegele, Yoruba Road and Taiwo Isale, engaging traders and individuals on the benefits of Stamp Duty which include document authentication and admissibility in court, prevention of fraud and disputes, access to loans and mortgages, among others.

The widespread awareness sparked constructive engagement between the traders and the campaign team, as many individuals were able to get accurate responses to Stamp Duty-related issues on the spot.

The team also visited some KW-IRS offices within Ilorin to ensure that staff have proper understanding of Stamp Duty in order to adequately sensitize taxpayers whenever the need arises in the line of duty.





KW-IRS Holds Strategic Training For Staff On Integrated Tax Intelligence And Revenue Optimization



In a bid to further enhance capacity for efficient tax administration and revenue mobilization, the Kwara State Internal Revenue Service (KW-IRS) held a two-day workshop titled "Integrated Approach to Tax Intelligence, Fraud Detection and Customer Engagement for Revenue Optimization" for members of its workforce between Tuesday, 20th and Wednesday, 21st May, 2025 at its Corporate Head Office in GRA, Ilorin.

The workshop, which was facilitated by Adeyemi Owoeye and Muyiwa Aderibigbe of Moore Bishop & Rooks, commenced with an opening address by the Executive Chairman, KW-IRS, Shade Omoniyi, who emphasized the importance of data-driven decision making, fraud detection mechanisms, and taxpayer-centric strategies as vital components of modern tax administration. She reiterated the agency's commitment to innovation, transparency, and capacity development.

He urged staff to apply the knowledge gained towards enhancing service delivery and maximizing revenue generation for the State.









KW-IRS Receives Unilorin and Kwasu Students On Educational Excursion

he Kwara State Internal Revenue Service (KW-IRS), on Wednesday, 18th June 2025, hosted members of the Nigerian Bar Association (NBA), Ilorin Branch to a one-day tax sensitization and engagement program themed "Strong Synergy with NBA in the drive of taxation in Kwara State" at the Ilorin Innovation Hub, G.R.A, Ilorin.

The program, according to the KW-IRS Executive Chairman, Shade Omoniyi, while delivering her opening remarks, is timely and pertinent to fostering a more mutual and productive working relationship with the legal community in the State.

She described the sensitization program as one of the special series in the KW-IRS stakeholders engagement program that is geared towards improved service delivery, bridging communication gaps, and a forum where clarity is provided to major growing legal concerns that bothers directly on the association, taxation as an obligation and KW-IRS as the sole revenue agency in the State.

Shade Omoniyi, while also emphasizing the importance and urgency of aligning the perspectives of both legal practitioners in the State and the Service, acknowledged their various contributions to the economic stability of the State over the past years. In her remarks, she reiterated the Service commitment to economic viability, improved IGR drive with full adoption of automation and introduction of modern-day technology that will assist transparency, prudence, and accountability in revenue administration.

The sensitization program featured a series of paper presentations from KW-IRS executives, focusing on ethical work relations between KW-IRS and the Nigerian Bar Association (NBA); Business ethics of taxation by taxpayers, tradition and legal basis of tax assessment and payment.

The program also analyzed the legal framework of taxation in Nigeria, and the need for the legal practitioner's umbrella body in the State to encourage ethical working relationships with KW-IRS, among other discussions.





The session featured a questions and answers sessions, where participants sought clarity on various tax-related matters as they relate to tax laws and policies.

The Director, Income Tax, KW-IRS, Mohammed Usman, while delivering his closing remarks, appreciated members of the Nigerian Bar Association, (NBA) for their active participation and insightful contributions during the program. He emphasized the critical role of legal professionals in shaping a tax-compliant society through their clarity in the interpretation and advocacy of tax laws.

Usman assured continued partnership with the NBA as a means to further deepen public awareness of legal tax obligations. He also expressed KW-IRS readiness for more collaborative efforts with professional bodies to enhance revenue growth, accountability, and promotion of transparency in tax administration in the State.

The event had in attendance members of the KW-IRS top management team, selected Heads of Departments, and representatives from the Service.



KW-IRS RECOVERS FIVE STOLEN VEHICLES



The Kwara State Internal Revenue Service (KW-IRS) has recorded tremendous feats in the discovery and recoveries of five stolen vehicles from the year 2023 to date, out of which four have been successfully handed over to the rightful owners while the fifth which was recently recovered on 30th May, 2025 is currently being processed.

The five vehicles recovered over the past few years are two Toyota Corolla, one Toyota Sienna, one Mazda Premacy, and a Toyota Matrix, which were separately reported stolen from Plateau, Ondo, Ogun, and Oyo States within the years.

The thefts were discovered during the standard verification protocols established by KW-IRS using its Vehicle Management System (VMS) platform created for registration and renewal of vehicle documents, when users of the vehicles presented the particulars and the Motor Licencing Officers observed that the vehicles had been reported stolen.

KW-IRS in collaboration with the Kwara State Police Command established contacts with the authentic vehicle owners and ensured the safe return of their vehicles. Separate appreciation letters as an acknowledgment of exceptional performance by the Service were sent by the owners after joyously receiving their vehicles.



In a statement issued at the KW-IRS Corporate Head Office in Ilorin, the Executive Chairman, Shade Omoniyi, while assuring Kwarans and the general public of quality service delivery in revenue administration of the State, described the remarkable recoveries as one among many success stories of the Service and evidence of the commitment of its workforce to professionalism and due diligence in the execution of duties and responsibilities.

She also sought public cognizance of the KW-IRS VMS which she described as an institutionalized and integrated vehicle management platform that has earned the Service more credibility and recognition in vehicular issues since it was introduced.

KW-IRS CONCLUDES 2025 VIRTUAL TAX CLUB QUIZ



The Kwara State Internal Revenue Service (KW-IRS), in collaboration with the Ministry of Education and Human Capital Development has concluded the preliminary stages of the 2025 edition of the Tax Club Quiz Competition on Friday 27th June, 2025.

The preliminary rounds commenced on 23rd June 2025, following a coordinated mock test organized by KW-IRS for all registered schools to enable the students familiarize themselves with the online Computer-Based Test (CBT) format from the convenience of their respective schools.

A total of ninety-nine (99) schools from across the State registered for the competition, with eighty-eight (88) eventually participating in the online CBT preliminary stage. After the first round, forty (40) schools advanced to the second round.

At the end of the two preliminary rounds, twelve (12) schools have qualified for the semi-final stage of the competition. The qualified schools, four (4) from each Senatorial District, are Osi Central Secondary School, Osi, Ansar Ud Deen College, Offa, Government Secondary School, Share, and Ansarul Islam Grammar School, Ijomu Oro from Kwara South; Deeper Life High School, Ilorin, Saint Anthony's Secondary School, Ilorin, Ebenezer High School, Ilorin and Roemichs International School, Ilorin from Kwara Central; Shepherd School, Lafiagi, Government Secondary School Ilesha Baruba, Government Secondary School, Lafiagi, and Unique College, Kaiama from Kwara North.

Speaking on behalf of the Executive Chairman, Shade Omoniyi, the Convener of the KW-IRS Tax Club Advocacy Committee (TACAC), Funmilola Oguntunbi, commended the seamless execution of the online preliminary stages, emphasizing that the virtual format introduced in recent editions continues to reflect the Service's commitment to innovation and digital transformation. "Our transition to a virtual model has laid the foundation for the successful conduct of this year's preliminary rounds. It has made participation easier and more inclusive", she said.

Representatives from the Ministry of Education and Human Capital Development, Mrs. Roseline Ayansola, Mrs. Alaaya Idayat Olawale and Mrs. Felicia Bamidele, who were actively involved in backend monitoring and result analysis, commended all participating schools for embracing the challenge and praised the top twelve for their impressive performance. They also noted that this year's process has so far recorded remarkable successes, congratulating all schools that participated in the competition.

The semi-final stage is scheduled to hold virtually on 6th October, 2025, after which six schools will proceed to the grand finale, which will hold physically in Ilorin on 6th November, 2025. The winning schools will compete for the grand prize of ***2.5 million.
